

Cruciferous vegetables like broccoli are helpful in the prevention of heart disease and cancer.




Brazil nuts

FROM THE DESK OF THE GRAND BASILEUS



June 3, 2019

Brothers.

I thank the members of the Supreme Council, particularly the district representatives, for working hard during this moratorium to reduce our risk as it relates to social events and successfully completing MSP processes that started prior to the moratorium. During this moratorium, the Offices of the Grand Counselor and Inspector General have gathered an acute understanding of social function risk and how it is measured and reduced in the climate in which we are operating. As a result, effective June 10, 2019, I will lift the moratorium on social events/activities. However, the moratorium on MSP continues. In our never-ending effort to maintain the safest approach to events and the reduction of risk to the extent possible, for future social events/activities, the following requirements are now in place:

GRADUATE CHAPTERS

- Will continue to end events earlier than has been typical in the past;
- Will continue to increase the security presence by 50% over SEC standards (1.5 officers per 100 attendees) and these officers will remain on the clock and premises through the complete exodus of the event;
- Will continue to implement alcohol curbing mechanisms in the form of punch cards or drink tickets which will be in the exclusive control of the 3rd party vendor who is responsible for service of alcohol
- Will continue to have a ninety (90) minute buffer between sale/serving (last patron consumption) of alcohol and event conclusion (ex. If the event concludes at 1:00am, last consumption will be at 11:30pm);
- Will continue to adhere to the requirements of the SEC in addition to the above, including
 appropriately executed contracts, appropriately executed certificates of insurance, and etc. as has
 been the case through a consistent approach monitored by our Legal Department, headed by the
 Office of the Grand Counselor and his designees.
- The District Representative and the District Counselor will sign all SECs. Final approval and notification of approval will come from IHQ with ongoing monitoring by the Inspector General.

UNDERGRADUATE CHAPTERS

- Will host all events on its college/university campus with the exception listed below, adhering to campus rules and regulations;
- Will continue to end events earlier than has been typical in the past;
- Will continue to prohibit the sale/serving/consumption of alcohol at events;
- Will have all SECs signed by their chapter advisor;
- Will have chapter advisor/designee attend the event;
- Will continue to increase the security presence by 50% over SEC standards (1.5 officers per 100
 attendees) and these officers will remain on the clock and premises through the complete exodus of
 the event;

- Will enjoy the exception of having one social event per fiscal year off campus but it will have to be approved by their supervising graduate chapter; SEC must be submitted in the name of its supervising graduate chapter; supervising graduate chapter will retain direct supervision of the event and all of its related activities throughout the entirety of the event; undergraduate chapters must secure event insurance; advisor and/or designee and graduate chapter members must attend this event; and chapter must comply with all aforementioned regulations for on campus events;
- Will continue to adhere to the requirements of the SEC in addition to the above, including
 appropriately executed contracts, appropriately executed certificates of insurance, and etc. as has
 been the case through a consistent approach monitored by our Legal Department, headed by the
 Office of the Grand Counselor and his designees.
- The District Representative and the District Counselor will sign all SECs. Final approval and notification of approval will come from IHQ with ongoing monitoring by the Inspector General.

FOR JOINT EVENTS

- For joint Graduate Chapter/Undergraduate Chapter events, they must comply with the aforementioned regulations for undergraduate chapter events and there shall be no alcohol sold/served/consumed by Graduate brothers or Undergraduate brothers at the event;
- Undergraduate Chapters doing events with other Undergraduate Chapters must comply with the aforementioned regulations for undergraduate chapter events and have both supervising graduate chapters sign the SECs.
- Any graduate and undergraduate chapters that do joint events with other non-Omega organizations, including affiliates and/or foundations must in addition to the above regulations get event insurance and have these non-Omega organizations get insurance and list Omega as an additional insured on their policy.
- The District Representative and the District Counselor will sign all SECs. Final approval and notification of approval will come from IHQ with ongoing monitoring by the Inspector General.

Brothers, we need to continue to police ourselves if we're going to reduce our risk at our social events. I want to be very clear that any brother or chapter that attempts to circumvent these rules will receive sanctions that will start with suspension up to expulsion, chapter revocation and will not exclude legal recourse. Again, the moratorium on social events/activities will be lifted June 10, 2019. However, the moratorium on MSP continues. I thank you in advance for governing yourselves accordingly.

82nd Grand Conclave Registration

Greetings Brothers,

I hope all is well with you and yours.

Last evening, the Supreme Council approved the budget for our 82nd Grand Conclave to be held in Tampa, FL next year.

The budget includes an "EARLY BIRD" registration period. Please save the dates of July 8 thru July 21, 2019 on your calendars.

If all goes according to the plan, IHQ will have those dates open for the Brotherhood to register and take advantage of the following EARLY BIRD rates:

\$395 for Graduate Brothers \$295 for Undergraduate Brothers

The regular rate will become effective on July 22, 2019 and is scheduled to stay effective until March 31, 2020. Those "regular" rates will be the following:

\$495 for graduate Brothers \$350 for Undergraduate Brothers

The final scheduled rates are defined as the "PEAK" rates. That period will be April 1, 2020 thru June 20, 2020. The PEAK rates are as follows:

\$550 for Graduate Brothers \$450 for Undergraduate Brothers

So again, please make note and save the dates for the planned "EARLY BIRD" registration rates for our 82nd Grand Conclave.




